For those of us who knew him, who remember him, I bring nothing new. But for those of us who have allowed the Church's misrepresentations of what he was all about, who have allowed Rome's falsehoods to distort his legacy, I bring a treasure trove of yesterday. Part II: The Investigation into the Vatican Murders of 1978

Early on the afternoon of March 15, 1978, eight men sat around a table in a sidewalk café in the mountain village of Vittorio Veneto in Northern Italy. In casual clothes they went unnoticed though one was the reigning Pontiff, a second was his Secretary of State, a third was the Patriarch of Venice, a fourth was the Primate of China, a fifth was the Metropolitan of Leningrad, and the seventh was their trusted confidant. And the eighth man? His name was Aldo Moro. Together they comprised the leadership of the progressive movement in Christianity. It was the composition of these eight men that was the great enemy of the Curia, that cluster of twenty or so right wing cardinals that shared the Vatican with Paul VI. They left at four o'clock and Aldo reserved the table for "This time next year."

On the morning of March 15, 1979, Cardinal Leon Joseph Suenens awoke. He had decided not to travel to Vittorio Veneto that day. After all, all the others were dead. And he, having just been removed as Primate of Belgium - no longer with pastoral influence - was, too, as good as dead.
